



Lumber Manufacturers' Association who spoke to the impacts of the Provincial government's Old Growth Deferral. The delegation stated that 70,000 ha of approved cutting permits in the region will be affected by the temporary pause on harvest and development planning. The representatives expressed that the deferral could be debilitating for the many ILMA members and their employees who live and work in the RDKB.

The Board will request a meeting with Katrine Conroy, Minister of Forests, Lands, Natural Resource Operations and Rural Development, to discuss the Old Growth Deferral and its impact on regional district communities and residents.

Board supports grant request for Little Red Schoolhouse

The Board will send a letter of support to the Trails to the Boundary Society to accompany its application to Heritage BC for a grant for the Little Red Schoolhouse. Grant monies will fund architectural and engineering fees for the renovation of the historic building

RDKB moves on North-South Corridor Initiative

The RDKB will send a letter to the Province of BC requesting information about the condition and future of the Waneta Bridge and the north-south transportation corridor connecting Washington State to the Trans-Canada Highway.

The RDKB is concerned about the future economic growth of our region and is witnessing continued interest in businesses moving to the area. A long-term need for improved transportation networks to our border has been identified. Currently, much of the heavy-goods traffic through the lower Columbia region leaves the valley and travels up through the City of Rossland to return downhill to the Paterson border crossing. The Board is concerned about safety on the highways, especially in winter conditions; further, all traffic passes directly through the busy downtown core of Rossland and through elementary school zones. Environmental improvements can also be realized if major commercial traffic has an alternate option, significantly reducing the vehicle emissions associated with road climbs to and from the border.



It's ice fishing season!

In early winter, the much-anticipated annual ice-fishing season has anglers getting excited. In the Interior of BC, from December to March, it gets and stays cold enough to freeze hundreds of lakes. The most sought-after species of game fish are rainbow,

eastern brook, and lake trout, along with kokanee and even burbot.

To be a successful ice fisher, there are some important things to consider before you venture out. Check your freshwater regulations to be sure that there is not an ice-fishing closure or bait ban in place on the water body you want to fish. Note any special conservation regulations concerning burbot, which have been overfished in a number of Interior lakes. Ice thickness should be a minimum of 10 centimetres to be safe for foot travel, and twice that for ATVs and snowmobiles.

- (3) a chair, or ice-fishing bucket for tackle or sitting on
- (4) a commercially made ice-fishing shelter for fishing in colder weather
- (5) fish finder (optional)
- (6) ice-fishing rod or small light spin rod
- (7) rod holder
- (8) basic tackle (leader line, hooks, small jigs, attractor

spoons, swivels, and small split shot or worm weights

(9) bait (deli shrimp, earthworms, krill, mealworms, single salmon eggs, salmon roe, woodworms, or Power Bait).

Since fish tend to travel in schools at this time of year, it is essential to scout a lake to try to locate where the main concentrations of fish are holding. Try off points of land, or in bays where the bottom tapers up to the shore evenly.

When you have picked a location, be sure to make several holes in a line from deep to shallow to figure out where in the

water column the fish are located. When you first drop your lure into a hole, let it hit bottom, and then raise it up 60 centimetres (a couple of feet). Some days you will find success by fishing five to 10 minutes in one hole, then moving to another until you locate the fish. If you are fishing in three metres (10 feet) of water or deeper, vary the depths of your lures, since the fish may be stratified at different depths in certain spots on the lake.

If there are several anglers fishing together, always vary your lure choices; that will increase cont'd on next pg

Our lakes and rivers remain free from destructive mussels

The BC Invasive Mussel Defence Program was in full swing in 2021. The goal of the program is to prevent the introduction of zebra and quagga mussels (ZQM) into BC. The program began in 2015 and consists of watercraft inspection stations, an outreach program, and lake monitoring.

In 2021, the Central Kootenay Invasive Species Society (CKISS) collected 267 samples from nine waterbodies in the Central Kootenay region as part of the provinces' mussel lake monitoring program. The samples were then sent to a provincial lab for analysis.

The CKISS recently received good news - all the samples came back negative for the presence of ZQM!

ZQM are two freshwater invasive species that are originally from the Baltic Sea. They were introduced to North America's Great Lakes in the 1980s via ballast water of international shipping vessels. They have since spread throughout Ontario, Quebec, Manitoba, and twenty-four America states. Early detection of ZQM is critical because they have negative impacts on biodiversity, water quality, recreation, fisheries, species at risk, and infrastructure such as hydropower facilities and municipal water supplies.

The negative results report is welcome news considering earlier in the year the province and CKISS were alerted that live invasive zebra mussels had been found in shipments of

aquarium moss balls sold at pet stores in BC and other western provinces and states. The BC Conservation Officer Service sprang into action and reached out to over 1100 pet stores and seized more than 9000 moss balls to prevent the sale of moss balls that may be contaminated with ZQM.

The overland movement of uncleaned watercraft and related equipment is the number one way that ZQM spread to a new waterbody. The small mussels attach to hard surfaces, like boat hulls, and can survive for several weeks out of water. In addition, the free-swimming larvae of ZQM can survive for weeks in standing water in a boat's bilge, ballast, wells, or engine compartments. For this reason, the BC Invasive Mussel Defence

Program coordinated nine water craft inspection stations along major transportation corridors throughout the province from mid-May to late October 2021. It is mandatory for ALL watercraft to stop at these stations to be inspected for the presence of ZQM.

It would only take one contaminated boat to start a new ZQM infestation! CKISS would like to remind the public that




